

EUROPE MUST GO



- **Deep Renovation** of the existing building stock is key for the EU to meet its climate goals, reduce the need for energy imports and eliminate fuel poverty. The EU needs to **at least triple its current rate (1.2% - 1.4%) of buildings renovation**
- **Eurima** asks that future **EU Energy Policy** must reflect the need for **deep renovation** of existing buildings. This requires combining: **conviction, cash, compliance, communication and compulsory targets**
- **Energy efficiency** and deep renovation of buildings through measures such as **mineral wool insulation**, will create European **sustainable jobs, boost higher and professional education** and above all will help citizens **save billions of Euro** annually
- **Partial** renovation of buildings **will not deliver** to the EU its environmental objectives. The EU has committed to cut **80%-95%** of its **CO₂ emissions** by 2050. Buildings are responsible for **40%** of the total EU energy consumption and **36%** of CO₂ emissions. Deep renovation of an old building can improve its energy performance by up to **85% to 90%**

DEEP Renovation is the motto for Europe, with a **new focus** on **old buildings**. Europeans are counting on policy makers to act!
